Our Summer Camp 2015 program begins Monday June 1 and we are looking forward to seeing returning campers. We are open from 7:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. and we will be closed July 3 in observance of Independence Day.

Tuition is \$ 150.00 a week and includes all meals (breakfast, two snacks and lunch) and field trips – there are no additional fees. Minimum enrollment during the program is eight weeks. Our program is a closed program, meaning we enroll only a certain number of students, with each child taking up a full spot. Therefore, your child's planned attendance schedule is flexible. However, we do not offer daily rates for walk-ins. Therefore, tuition is due for any week of attendance regardless of absent days or days we are closed.

Program Description: We address both educational and recreational needs of children with field trips and activities structured within a themed based curriculum. We emphasize respect, responsibility, honesty, and caring through the natural course of events each day.

Field Trips: We will be taking trips to Coney Island Amusement Park, the Beach Water Park, Kids First Sports Center, Cincinnati Red's Ball Park for a game, Colerain Bowl two times for Glow Bowling, Cincinnati Zoo, Contemporary Art Center, Dewey's Pizza, Skyline, several trips to Graeters and Burnett Woods, B&B Riverboat Pirate Cruise down the Ohio River, a trip to Sawyer Point/ Yeatman's Cove, a trip to the Carew Tower Observation Deck downtown, and we take four swim trips to the Hanna 'Armleder Aquatic Center Pool/Playground (with waterslides) to play and swim. Two life guards and a gate attendant will be at the pool as well as our own two staff members. A detailed field trip itinerary is attached to the enrollment packet.

Summer Curriculum: Our activities such as field trips, class room and outdoor activities, and art activities are designed to help children develop new skills, make new friends, and most of all enjoy their summer break. Science, language, math and music skills are challenged through group times, friendly competition, and through various activities provided. Throughout the summer children will prepare for a carnival and invite the preschool children to attend.

Staffing/Group Size: Our teachers will be Mrs. Mary Grace and Mr. Patrick. Mary Grace is a certified teacher and intervention specialist, and has worked with our program for over 7 years (4 as summer camp teacher). Mr. Patrick is full-time center employee and has worked with our program since January 2013 as our cook and school-age after-school teacher. The director attends several trips. Our maximum group size will be 28. However, we will go over 28 if need be to keep from turning away children who attended our camp last summer.

Facility: Our summer camp is located in the church building and includes a playground, indoor gym play area, and a large class room with a library area and areas for games, dramatic play, blocks, toys, science, and sensory tables for items such as play-doh & water activities. There is also a large art area and an area for special art activities, lunches and snacks.
